Special Congregational Meeting, May 1, 2016

In Article 5, it states that the church council should consist of not less than 6 and no more than 10 members. Section 6, however, is in conflict stating that the council should consist of 6 members. We need to add the words "to 10" to that section to coincide with Article 5.

Wendell Finer moved to add the words "to 10" to Section 6 and Joan West seconded and it passed unanimously.

Wendell moved to adjourn the meeting, seconded by Larry West. Motion carried. Meeting was adjourned.

The secretary's report was read and approved.

Carrol gave the treasurer's report. We had income last month of \$3837.00 with expenses of \$10,169.00. Carrol paid ½ of the benevolences. That is why the expenses are so high. Lanette moved and Wendell seconded to accept treasurer's report. Motion carried.

We discussed various charitable causes that have sent letters to the church. Some we already support. We will keep the others in mind for later.

The pew cushions are in tough shape. The buttons are coming off and the padding is deteriorating. Lanette is going to mention the shape of the cushions to the ladies. We decided to table further discussion until later.

The Riemann family is working on getting the memorial flag and pole installed. Garret Fjeld will mow the lawn until he leaves to study abroad in July. Terry Durby has a key pad dead bolt lock for the back door.

The PASTOR'S PEN by Rev. Steve Bang

Since the beginning of time there has been a conflict between good and evil. Recently, it has seemed to intensify and it should not alarm us but it should wake us up. A new documentary film on DVD called "Agenda 2: Masters of Deceit" is one that should be seen by Christians. We showed it recently to the midweek Bible study group and it is available from Pastor Steve if you would like to view it at home.

It proclaims that America is at the most vulnerable time since the Revolutionary War. When there is vulnerability, people become afraid, and then they ask government to do more. Filmmaker Curtis Bowers did not believe there was a Communist agenda in the early 1990s. The Soviets had been brought down by Ronald Reagan. The Berlin Wall came down. But then he learned of the 45 Communist goals in a book by Cleon Skousen written in 1958 and he started on a journey. It resulted in two films that are an expose of the Marxist agenda to take down America. The second film is the one of which I speak.

The agenda to take America down began over 100 years ago. It originated with Marx and Engels, but Vladimir Lenin put things into practice a century ago. They are installing it in increments, thus the term 'progressivism'. As Lenin said, they can't get their agenda through all at one time so they compromise. It's okay if it takes 100 or 200 years. They are patient.

HS graduates honored at WP






We don't know what the future holds for these three young men, but we know Who holds the future. God's blessings to you.
