This will be led by the Zion youth worship team. The theme is "Avengers of Good". They will provide promotional material. Contact person from West Prairie will be Lanette Branstad.

Under new business we discussed that some of the cemetery stones need repairing. Jan will talk to Bill Schutter and Terry Durby about the expense being taken out of the cemetery fund.

We need to have Young's Plumbing and Heating to

come and inspect the air conditioner and do the maintenance. Lanette moved to do that, Wendell seconded and motion carried.

Jan feels that if we got gutters on the church proper it would eliminate the leaks via the vents. The increased water flow from the roof comes into the vents and leaks into the addition. He will check on pricing.

Other topics we discussed were that we need new toner for the copy machine that is covered in the maintenance agreement. The bushes need trimming again. We need to remind Bill and Terry about getting someone to mow the church and cemetery yard because Garrett is leaving the first part of July. The ladies are planning on repairing the church cushions.

The next meeting will be July 13th. Wendell moved to adjourn, Julie seconded and motion carried.

I recently received a small book entitled, "I Am a Church Member" by Thom S. Rainier. It reveals that following Jesus involves far more than believing — it involves belonging. Only as we belong to Christ's body can we become what he intends us to be. In fact, it is impossible to grow to spiritual maturity by yourself. You must be connected to the other parts of the body, Christ's church.

Nothing compares to a group of believers who love one another, pray for each other and serve God together to reach their neighbors. Few congregations meet this description, however. We have failed to reach about Biblical church membership and we have reaped what we've sown — membership without meaning and members without commitment. Church membership carries both privilege and responsibility.

In the introduction to his book, Rainer suggests that congregations across America are weak because many church members have lost the Biblical understanding of what it means to be part of the body of Christ. We join churches expecting others to serve us, to feed us, and to care for us. We don't like hypocrites in the church, but we fail to see our own hypocrisies.

God did not give us local churches to become country clubs, where membership means we have privileges and perks. He placed us in churches to serve, to care for others, to pray for leaders, to learn, to teach, to give, and in some cases, to die for the sake of the gospel.

WOW members host salad luncheon, special program

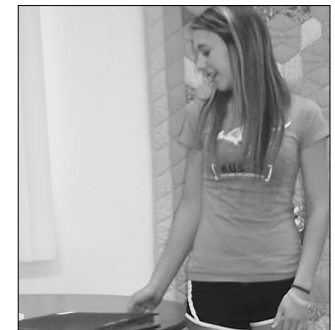
Quilters and guests halted their work at noon to enjoy a variety of salads and desserts on Wednesday, June 8th.

Utilize the Clear Lake Resource Center

The Lutheran Resource Center (LRC), located on Hwy. 18 in Clear Lake, operates as a lending library for a myriad of ideas, support and help in developing programs for Sunday School, Bible studies and other programs. It is designed to give churches access to a wide range of resources and tools that some congregations are not able to secure for their ministry. Curriculum samples from various publishers are also available to peruse before purchase.

LRC is a non-profit outreach ministry of Zion Lutheran Church in Clear Lake. The Center opened in 1972 after Rev. W. Salvesson's idea of collecting resources for congregations to borrow rather than purchase the materials flourished.

Member congregations also have access to the-workofthepeople.com with Bible and other studies that can be downloaded.

Financial support for LRC comes from congregational memberships, chari-

table contributions and grants. Congregational membership fees are based on average membership attendance. Memberships are not charged usage fees, but users are responsible for paying postage from and to LRC.

The Resource director since 1997 is Karen Harthan and is the go-to person who will assist you with your ideas or can provide connections to other resources or people.

West Prairie has a membership to the LRC making access to books, devotionals, videos as easy as going to your local library. Items can either be picked up at the store or sent to you by the most economical shipping method.
