# **Message from Pastor Scalisi**

Christ's Forgiveness is Incredible.

For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—<sup>9</sup> not by works, so that no one can boast. Ephesians 2:8-9 NIV

We have all been hurt by someone at some time. Sometimes that wound was so deep that we hurt for a long time. Sometimes we had to forgive that person numerous times. This is what prompted Peter's question, "Lord, how many times shall I forgive my brother or sister who sins against me? Up to seven times?" Matthew 18:21 NIV Jesus' response was startling. "I tell you, not seven times, but seventy-seven times." Matt. 18:22 But is this a turn number? Does Jesus really want us to keep track? By no means! Seven is a perfect number in the Bible and so what Jesus was saying is a perfect number times a perfect number or an infinite number.

But why do we forgive our neighbors? Simple, because God has mercy for us. This is explained in the parable following this conversation between Jesus and Peter. God, our king forgives the servant and in turn the servant should have mercy on his fellow servant. WE have the capacity and should love our neighbor because God first loved us.

God does not keep a score card of our sins. God forgives us not because of what we do or how we act. He forgives us because of who He is. He forgives because of His unwavering unlimited love for His people. When we forgive others, we strengthen our bond as Christians. We are all brothers and sisters in the Body of Christ and therefore, as one body we are obligated to forgive others as we say in the Lord's Prayer.
